Dear Languedoc members and friends,

Here's some advice from Gill as we approach the months of heat and drought, although given the weather we've experienced recently this seems an unlikely prospect!

"In mediterranean France there is likely to be a period of drought during the summer months. Most people water their gardens from time to time and recently planted items will need additional water during their first summer. A thorough watering as needed is much more effective than frequent light watering, which encourages surface roots which can then dry out. When water penetrates the soil deeply, it encourages a strong rooting system and plants will be less susceptible to wind rock, drought and winter cold. Creating a small depression around the base of the plant helps direct the water to the plant's roots.

Try to water in the evening when evaporation rates are lower. Think about water conservation strategies: mulching with chipped bark, shredded garden waste or compost helps to reduce evaporation, keeps weeds down and adds organic material to the soil. You can also use mineral mulches such as gravel or Pouzzolane. If you don't already have a system for composting your vegetable and garden waste think about setting one up – it's a great source of organic material to improve your soil. Note that containers and hanging baskets may need watering daily during very hot periods. If you have an irrigation system make sure that it is functioning correctly if you are going away. Reflect on your use of water and think about where you can be more economical.

Many mediterranean plants flower in the spring and enter a state of rest during the summer, some (eg *Medicago arborea*, *Clematis cirrhosa*) are at least partly summer deciduous. This can mean that there is less colour in the summer garden, so look around, note what looks good at this time of year and build this into your thinking for the future.

During the summer months:

- Continue to check for damage by slugs, snails and insects and take appropriate action
- If you have plants with variegated or golden foliage keep an eye out for any wholly green shoots and prune these out immediately
- Deadheading perennials after flowering will often encourage a second flowering
- Vigorous climbers such as wisteria and trumpet vines (Campsis) may need pruning during the summer
- Cut back dead bulb foliage
- Cut back spring flowering shrubs
- Clip aromatics such as santolina and lavender after flowering, but note that lavenders should never be cut back into old wood
- Collect seeds

The summer months are much less busy in the garden – time to relax and enjoy it – and perhaps to make plans for the autumn!"
