Programme of activities for 2014

Thursday 9 January, 11.00am Restaurant Le Tracteur, Argilliers (30)
A talk on mediterranean geophytes, by John Fielding, co-author of *Flowers of Crete*



John is an expert on mediterranean geophytes (bulbs, corms, rhizomes) and will pick out a selection suitable for the climate here in France, including some more unusual varieties. He is a member of the RHS Photographic Committee and will illustrate his talk (in English, but with simultaneous French translation if required) with many photographs of mediterranean bulbs growing in the wild.

The cost for the talk will be 7€ per person.

Tuesday 4 March, 11.00am Bulb'Argence, Fourques (30) A workshop on soil by David Bracey

David writes:

Soil is a complex and precious commodity. On the 4th of March we will examine and make a mechanical analysis of our own soils. I would like each of you to bring a soil sample from your own garden and a screw tight jam jar so that we can look at what components you can find in your soil.

Bring some kitchen paper since you will be handing your own soil to hear the sand, roll the clay and feel the silkiness of silt. I will be sending more instructions on how to take your soil sample closer to the date.

It will be a fun day....if messy."

The workshop will be held in the garden of mediterranean bulb specialist, Bulb'Argence, in Fourques, www.bulbargence.com where many early bulbs will be in flower. Please bring a picnic lunch.

28/29/30 March, Algarve, Portugal 3rd International Spring Conference

A talk by paysagiste, Jean-Sylvain Bussac, followed by a visit to the gardens

In the morning, Jean-Sylvain Bussac, garden designer and paysagiste, based in Aix-en-Provence, will talk to us in French about using combinations of colour and shape to create different visual effects in the garden. www.jardinpaysage-bussac.com.

At lunchtime, Sophie de Brignac, owner of the Mas de Payan, has invited us to eat our picnics in the garden, followed by a walk around the 13 hectares of park and gardens. Work on the gardens started in 1981 with the planting of hedges, trees and shrubs. Over the following thirty years the garden was developed and now has an arboretum, a potager and a collection of unusual plants, many raised from seeds and cuttings collected by the owners.
