Saturday 16 January, 2.30pm, Devezou, Montferrier (34) Talk, in French, by Chantal Guiraud and Joelle Moine: *Jardins de Chine*

Joelle Moine and Chantal Guiraud will talk to us about their recent travels in China. Joelle will start by talking about gardens and bonsai trees in northern China and Peking. Chantal will then take us along a journey through southern China, through Canton, Guilin and especially Suzhou where she saw masterpieces of Chinese garden art.

This event has been organised by our partner association, Hortus, and will include a traditional seasonal *galette*.

This will not be a long boring slide show, rather an illustrated commentary on what they saw, with the hope that the group may be able to identify some of their unnamed plant photographs. If weather permits, Françoise will take people on a short tour of interesting houses in the old village.

Wednesday/Thursday 11/12 May, Tourrettes-sur-Loup and Grasse, (06) Charity rose 'baptême' and garden visits

MGF has been invited to host the 'baptism' of a new rose, created by *rosiéristes* Jean-Pierre Dittiere and Dominique Massad for the charity Rainbows4Children www.rainbows4children.org. Although developed in the Loire valley, the new rose will have characteristics which make it suitable for growing in the Mediterranean climate conditions of southern France. All profits from the sale of the rose will go to Rainbows4Children. Joanna Millar, whose garden in Tourrettes-sur-Loup is home to a wonderful variety of roses, has generously offered to host the event.

Programme for the two days:

11/05 Morning A walk around Joanna's garden followed by the rose baptême and a finger buffet

lunch.

Afternoon A visit to La Mouissone, Maggie Lockett's garden. Cyril Valherie will give us a

demonstration and talk on the pruning and care of trees, hedges and ornamental

shrubs then we can wander round the garden, followed by tea and cakes.

12/05 Morning A guided tour of part of the 8 hectare garden of the Domaine St Jacques de

Couloubrier, led by Pierre JeanJean the head gardener. The garden was laid out

in the 1950s by Russell Page and has a large collection of Nabonnand roses.

Afternoon A visit to the garden of the villa de Fort France, constructed in the thirties by

Lady Fortescue and now owned by Valérie de Courcel, the painter. The terraced space is filled with mediterranean plants, perhaps 1000 different species.

For those who will need accommodation for this trip, the owners of la Mouissone and of the Domaine St Jacques de Couloubrier have offered bed and breakfast in their homes/guest cottages at very reasonable rates.

International activities

19 - 25 April 2016, MGAP/MGi event in Sintra, Lisbon and the western Algarve, Portugal Dry Gardens in the Mediterranean 'an undiscovered diversity'

This event, organised by the Mediterranean Gardening Association Portugal, in conjunction with Mediterranean Gardening International, will be in two parts.



19 - 21 April: A pre-conference tour based in the UNESCO world heritage town of Sintra, with two full days of guided visits to historic and private gardens in Lisbon, Colares and Sintra.

22 - 24 April: Travel to Lagos for the main conference weekend. The weekend will include a talk by Olivier Filippi, guided wild flower walks and garden visits. Lagos is close to the Cape St. Vincent Peninsula National Park, an area of immense botanical importance with numerous endemic and rare species. The area is also famous for bird watching on the nearby Sagres Peninsula.



25 April, return to Lisbon, with a garden visit in the Alentejo region, on the way.

For members travelling from southern France there is a daily Ryanair flight between Marseille and Lisbon, and TAP Portugal or Easyjet flights between Nice and Lisbon. If flight and train times remain as they are now, and you would like to take part in the whole programme, it would be best to travel out on Tuesday 19 April, returning on Tuesday 26 April.
