# Programme of activities in France

#### Wednesday 13 April, Correns and Cotignac (83) A wild flower walkwith Saskia Newlands

Saskia Newlands will lead this morning walk to look for wild flowers in the countryside near Correns. The walk will be followed by lunch in Cotignac.

# Thursday 14 April, 11.00am, near Orange, (84) A visit to Les Roches, a family garden planted in the 18<sup>th</sup> century



Babeth Tomlinson has organised this visit to an old family garden near Orange. The park, which was laid out in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, contains some interesting old trees and shrubs, including a cedar grown from seed brought to France around 200 years ago.

Please bring a picnic to eat in the garden at lunchtime. In the afternoon we will drive to Vacqueyras to explore the *Espace botanique Coste de Coa*, a natural site with wonderful views, and where over a hundred varieties of Mediterranean plants have been carefully labelled.

#### Friday 6 May, 10.30am, Grasse, (06) Visits to gardens near Grasse

June Grindley has arranged this visit to gardens near Grasse. In the morning we'll got to the garden of Mas de Pivoines. and in the afternoon, visit Villa Noailles, built in 1947 by the Vicomte de Noailles, who chose the location for the presence of a spring providing water for the canal and fountains.

# Wednesday/Thursday 11/12 May, Tourrettes-sur-Loup and Grasse (06) Charity rose 'baptême' and garden visits

MGF has been invited to host the 'baptism' of a new rose, created by *rosiéristes*Jean-Pierre Dittiere and Dominique Massad for the charity Rainbows4Children <u>www.rainbows4children.org</u>.

Although developed in the Loire valley, the new rose will have characteristics which make it suitable for growing in the Mediterranean climate conditions of southern France. Joanna Millar, whose garden in Tourrettes-sur-Loup is home to a wonderful variety of roses, has generously offered to host the event.

Programme for the two days:

11/05 Morning A walk around Joanna's garden, the rose baptême and a finger buffet lunch.

- Afternoon A visit to La Mouissonefor a workshop on pruning then a garden visit.
- 12/05 Morning A guided tour of the garden of the Domaine St Jacques de Couloubrier Afternoon A visit to the garden of the villa de Fort France, now owned by Valérie de Courcel, the painter.

There are places available for the rose baptême and lunch at Joanna's, but waiting list only for the other visits.

## Saturday 14 May, afternoon, Sausset-les-Pins (13) A botanical walk with Jean-Paul Maurice, an outing organised in partnership with Hortus



Sausset-les-Pins is a small village on the Côte Bleue, 30 minutes away from Marseille. Jean-Paul Maurice, pharmacist, botanist and mycologist, will lead us along the *sentier botanique* which runs along the coast and into the garrigue.

# Wednesday 18 May, La Valette-du-Var and Ollioules (83) Garden and nursery visits

A morning visit to Domaine d'Orvès, an eight-hectare estate with a system of spring-fed canals which provide water for the gardens. The 17th century house is backed by a dry hillside clothed in vines, almond and olive trees. The garden was started by painter, Pierre Deval, in 1925 and is now cared for by his daughter, Françoise Darlington. 
# A new section: <u>'Gardening for Wildlife'</u>.
