Wednesday afternoon

Thursday morning

Our AGM at the *Parc floral des cinq continents* created by Eric Dubois at his nursery near Marsillargues, on the edge of the *Petite Camargue*, followed by a '*méchoui*', a North-African style barbecue.

Thursday afternoon

Visits to the garden of retired horticulturalist and nurseryman, Henri Nardy. Henri is passionate about unusual plants which he cultivates both in his garden and in a large greenhouse for the more exotic specimens.

Friday morning

Olivier Filippi will take us round his garden on the edge of the *Etang de Thau* where we will have the opportunity to have an update on the progress of some his most recent projects, including the experimental area dedicated to plants with allelopathic properties.

Smartphone app

Tilly Chambers has spotted details of this app, <u>Pl@ntNet</u>, developed by a French company called Irina, which gives users the ability to snap a picture of an unknown flower or plant and upload it to a crowd-sourced database of over 100,000 images and 4000 species of plants growing in France. The app then provides suggestions as to what the plant may be.
