Wednesday/Thursday 14/15 September, Durban-Corbières and Caunes (Aude) Garden visits and a talk on grasses

The following day will include a visit to Gill Pound's garden at la Petite Pépinière with a talk on how to grow, propagate and design with grasses, a visit to Imogen and Kate's very new experimental garden, Le Jardin Champêtre, and a wild flower walk.

Saturday 17 September, 10.00am, La Gaude and Vence (Alpes-Maritimes) Visit to the gardens of L'Argelière and Villa Mariela, and the Matisse chapel

Martin Smith has organised this day out which starts with a visit to the garden of Lysiane Offerhaus, in la Gaude. Lysiane has a passion for plants and an encyclopaedic knowledge of their names. Her tree-filled garden is mostly in shade; plants are allowed to self-seed and some 'weeds' are tolerated to provide food for insects. Lysiane also knows a lot about plant diseases and has an ecological approach to pest control. In 2014, the garden was chosen by France 2 as *Le jardin préféré des Français* in the PACA region.
