Monday 6 November, 10.00, Cagnes-sur-Mer, Alpes-Maritimes Visit to the Renoir Museum

June Grindley writes:

"We are stretching the idea of a 'garden visit' a little for our year-end happening. On November 6, we are organising a tour of the Renoir Museum in Cagnes-sur-Mer. The museum is in the house where Auguste Renoir spent the last years of his life, from 1908 to 1919. It is also where his son, Jean Renoir, the film maker, fell for Auguste Renoir's model, Andrée Heuschling, who later became Jean's first wife. The museum is set in the heart of a magnificent estate with views over Cagnes and to Cap d'Antibes. The garden is filled with 300 year old olive trees which were painted by Renoir. After the tour, in English, we shall have lunch at a restaurant at the beach."

Perhaps, with the longer evenings, you will have time to look at some of the fascinating information on the websites of our partner associations. <u>The Home page</u> of the MGi website has links to those of each of the six associations.

I would particularly draw your attention to the following:



Mediterranean Gardening Association Portugal has taken its first steps towards the establishment of a botanic garden in the Algarve. It's located in the Barrocal zone of the Iberian Peninsula, a biodiversity hotspot with a distinct plant community. It's hoped that a visit to the garden will be included as part of the programme for the 2019 MGi event. Website here
