The couple commenced planting in the garden in 1990 on a soil which is heavy and chalky. This is a 'dry' garden with cypresses, olive trees and some old oak trees. After a picnic lunch we'll drive to Sarrians where we'll visit a garden (part of the Open Gardens /Jardins Ouverts scheme) being developed on a hectare of drained marshland.



Martin Smith has arranged this visit to Vallon du Brec, a *jardin remarquable* situated in the hinterland of Nice at a height of 1000 metres. It was created in 1992 by a painter and photographer and after a period of neglect, the new owners have breathed life back into the garden. It overlooks a small valley and contains plants from China, Japan and North America as well as indigenous ones. The planting is enhanced by painted wooden structures... pavilions, staircases and arches, redolent of Japan. In October the garden should be showing its autumnal colours.

19 and 20 September - Napoli and Caserta, ITALY Palaces and Historic Gardens in and around Caserta – organised by MGS Italy



This trip includes a visit to one of the marvels of Italy – La Reggia di Caserta, with special access to the royal apartments and the court theatre, plus visits to two private historical residences and gardens in the area: the Giardino Dei Duchi Guevara di Bovino and Palazzo Mondo with its historic courtyard garden typical of southern Italy. Also included is a visit to the renovated royal silk factory at Casino Reale del Belvedere and its terraced Giardini del Belvedere with panoramic views of La Reggia, Vesuvius and the entire Bay of Naples.
