The 2021 MGF Annual General Meeting

Wednesday 19 May, Pont-du-Gard



This will take place at the UNESCO World Heritage Site, Pont du Gard. The Roman aqueduct, built in the first century AD to carry water to the city of Nîmes, crosses the Gardon river near the town of Vers-Pont du-Gard.

We will hold the meeting in the morning at the Restaurant Les Terrasses on the Rive Droite. After the meeting there will be a lunch followed by a guided visit to the third level of the bridge for up to a maximum of 35 people. It will also be possible to explore the extensive site with its thousand year-old olive trees, botanical garden, preserved Mediterranean landscape - the 'Memoires de Garrigue' and a 19c charcoal kiln.

Wednesday 2 June 2021, Simiane la Rotonde, Alpes-de-Haute-Provence
A visit to the gardens of the Abbaye de Valsaintes and a talk on using essential oils in the garden



We have a new date for this visit to the 7th century Cistercian Abbaye de Valsaintes. The gardens are classed as a Jardin Remarquable and include a dry garden, with 350 plant species; an ecological potager, using permaculture techniques and a rose garden, where one follows a path tracing the history of roses (550 species). At an altitude of 600m, the abbey is ideally situated for roses which benefit from cooler nights.

The visit will be divided into two parts: in the morning, a guided 1h30 visit of the gardens (dry garden, roses, potager) with Jean-Yves Meignen.

This will be followed by a 30' guided tour of the church and demonstration of Gregorian chant. In the afternoon Jean-Yves will give us a talk and demonstration on using essential oils in the garden, including making blends for specific uses and how to apply them.
