In the morning, we will start with a guided visit to the remarkable medieval architecture of the town of Vézénobres, followed by a picnic at a site with panoramic views. The picnic will consist of locally made products such as fig pâté, vegetable terrine and biscuits. In the afternoon, we will go to the orchard-conservatory with a hundred varieties of fig tree, accompanied by a tasting. Later we will visit the museum, in the heart of the Château de Girard, which dates from the 14th century.

From Cal Hort: the flora of the Patagonia steppe - You tube link to Kiamara Ludwig's talk



The Patagonian steppe is the largest desert in Argentina, bounded by the Andes to the west and the Atlantic Ocean to the East. The eighth largest desert in the world by area, it is home to several species of desert shrubs and tuft grasses. The outskirts of the desert and the borders of the ephemeral lakes support larger plants.

The California Horticultural Society invited us to a Zoom meeting to hear a talk by Kiamara Ludwig, on the flora of the Patagonia steppe. Unfortunately, most members will have missed it, since it took place at 3.30am, French time. However, you can view the talk on CalHort's YouTube channel.
