PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES IN FRANCE

Friday 1 November Visits to Le Jardin Pomme d'Ambre and the Domaine de l'Olivette Organised by Jacqueline Potter

We will start the day at 10:30 at Pomme d'Ambre in Fréjus. Nicole Arboireau's enchanting garden, recognised as a Jardin Remarquable, benefits from the mild climate of the Côte d'Azur. Over many years, the owners have cultivated a stunning variety of Mediterranean plants and trees, including several rare species, making this garden a true delight for plant lovers. Nicole herself will show us around.

The entry ticket for this garden is 15€ per person, including a welcome drink and the guided tour. There is an option to benefit from a lower price: if you are a member of the garden, the price goes down to 10€.

After our morning visit, we'll head to Roquebrune-sur-Argens to explore the Domaine de l'Olivette, where Claire Delmotte, the owner, will guide us through the estate. The domaine not only produces a wide range of olives but is also home to various citrus trees and over 25 types of fruit trees.

During our visit, the olive harvest should be in full swing, offering us a unique glimpse into this traditional process. The domain produces a range of olive oil, olives, tapenades, and jams.

Sunday 20 – Sunday 27 October, Lycia, Turkey Autumn jewels of the Taurus Organised by Mediterranean Plants and Gardens

A one-week tour in south-west Turkey exploring habitats from the coast to the higher slopes, which still harbour stunning old growth cedar forests. There will be visits to Simena, Phaselis and Termessos, for the wild flora as well as for their history. Participants should see many species of colchicum, crocus and cyclamen and sternbergia. Wild flora of Elba

Friday 28 March to Saturday 5 April 2025



To explore the natural flora, with a 20-seater minibus and walking. The group will stay in a simple hotel (the Belmare) in Porto Azzurro which is a nice small seaside town with a couple of beaches nearby, though the weather may not be very inviting for swimming! Botanical guide: Goffredo Filibeck, who teaches at the University of Tuscia and led our visits to Maremma, which we ran twice because members enjoyed them very much. There will be at least three or four kilometres of walking – some on difficult terrain – each day, more if the group is enthusiastic about walking.

MPG's UK summer garden tour in Fife Sunday 22 to Thursday 26 June 2025



This distinct area of Scotland, bounded to the south by the Forth and to the north by the Tay, has fine gardens, some with views across the estuaries. We will visit gardens restored to former glory on country estates and others developed in recent years. Most of the tour will be in the East Neuk and we will stay just over the Tay on the waterfront in Dundee, with interesting cultural sites nearby. Thank you to Teasses for the image of their garden.

The unique flora of the Western and Northern Cape Thursday 14 to Wednesday 27 August 2025 Organised by Mediterranean Plants and Gardens



This tour will start and finish in Cape Town and will focus on the biodiversity of the unique fynbos vegetation and diversity of geophytes. Participants will see familiar garden plants growing in their natural habitat as well as many that are quite new. The Cape floristic region is home to the greatest non-tropical concentration of higher plant species in the world, with 9,000 species crammed into its small area. More than 6,200 (69 percent) of these are found nowhere else in the world.

The tour will be led by experienced guide, Frank Gaude. An optional extension from 27 - 31 August will provide an opportunity to see the sights of Cape Town and its surrounds. For more details, and to book, visit the MPG website.

The gardens of La Citadelle and La Louve, Vaucluse

In September, we visited two very different gardens in the adjacent villages of Ménerbes and Bonnieux in the Vaucluse.

Bruno Pellier and Robert Clerbout describe the impressive collection of informatively labelled aromatic plants, set out in square wooden containers, on a terraced hillside.

Beata Baran tells the story of Nicole de Vésian's iconic garden, La Louve, recounting how it has developed over almost 40 years under the stewardship of several owners, all of whom understood the need to preserve this living work of art.

Visits to gardens in Golfe-Juan and Antibes

Also in September, but further east, a group of members visited two interesting gardens in Golfe-Juan and Antibes. The first was a citrus grove, belonging to Adrien Strutynski, a professional agrumiculteur. Here, the group learned about the conditions necessary for successful citrus cultivation.

In the afternoon, Annie Zanini led a tour of her garden where she and her husband have successfully grown plants more typically found in a tropical forest: avocado trees, cussonia, murraya and *Petrea voubilis* (pictured).
