MGF Assemblée Générale 2025 - Seed Collection and Library

There has been no significant change in seed orders for 2024, they remain stable. I hope that even more of you will order in the autumn, which is the best time for sowing. For the time being (I don't think this will last) we can still send seeds to the USA (apply to the USDA/APHIS), the UK and outside the EU, with the exception of Australia. But we can no longer receive seeds from non-EU countries without a phytosanitary certificate.

Despite these difficulties, our supply of seeds has risen to 480 different taxa and if we add the Index Seminum of Château Pérouse, we reach the more than honourable figure of 1255 different taxa. Once again, many thanks to Mr Vos and to our kind donors.

I would like to take this opportunity to announce that I will be moving to a flat and will no longer have access to the seeds from my garden (over a hundred taxa). Having said that, I will still collect seeds from garden visits, with the permission of the owners. Please send me as many seeds as possible, in small quantities, as I can only keep fresh seeds and have to renew them every 3 years or so.

To send seeds, clean off their hulls, and place them in paper envelopes with their botanical names if possible, the year and place of harvest and post them to my current address. When the list is next updated in July 2025, my new address will be shown on our website.
