A visit to the gardens of <u>Chateau Val Joanis</u>, previously the property of Jean de Joanis, secretary of King Louis III of Naples and now a well-known winery. After an introductory talk, visit the vegetable garden, the flower garden and the ornamental garden.

Lunch on the square in Ansouis followed by a visit to the <u>chateau</u> and its gardens, guided by the owner, Mme Rousset-Rouvière.

Afternoon visit to the splendid gardens of the <u>Pavillon de Galon</u>. We will have a guided tour by the owner.

# Friday 9 May A visit to gardens in Lacoste and Saint-André-de-Sangonis, Hérault Organised by Chantal Guiraud

In the morning, a visit to the Roseraie du Cade, created in 2017. It comprises two sections: a collection of over 500 old rose bushes and the Gallic and Damask roses, used for distilling floral water. This is the ideal time to discover the petal harvest and then the distillation process in the copper still. The adjoining shop also offers floral waters, jams, syrups, and other delicacies.

After lunch at a local restaurant, we will head to the Jardin de la Font de Bézombes. It was created in the 1990s in a small valley. An abundant spring has created bodies of water and

fostered lush vegetation. Seven styles are represented: tropical, desert, marsh, Chinese, regular, herbs cloister, and vegetable garden.

# Wednesday 11 June A day visiting two exceptional gardens in Grasse (Alpes-Maritimes) Organised by Jacqueline Potter

**The Domaine Saint Jacques du Couloubrier** is a private 8hectare garden in Grasse, originally created in 1950 for Jean Prouvost by the renowned landscape designer Russell Page.

After many years of neglect, the estate was bought in 2005 and restored by its current owners, with great care taken to preserve the spirit of the original creation. Today, the garden continues to evolve under the guidance of the talented head gardener Pierre Jeanjean, who has introduced an impressive diversity of plant species.

Surrounding the house are various garden areas: Mediterranean gardens, olive trees, a rose garden featuring Nabonnand rose varieties, and beautiful water features. This exceptional garden, rarely accessible to the public, will be opened especially for MGF. Pierre Jeanjean will be our guide.

Villa Fort France, also in Grasse, is a historic garden created by British writer Lady Fortescue and her husband, librarian to King George VI.

The villa was built on terraced land planted with olive trees and aromatic plants. Even at that time, a rose garden was part of the design. Since then, the garden has continued to grow and evolve, now featuring a rich blend of Mediterranean and exotic species.

We will be welcomed by Valérie de Courcel, the owner.

## Sunday 22 to Thursday 26 June Summer garden tour in Fife Organised by Mediterranean Plants and Gardens

# Thursday 14 to Wednesday 27 August The unique flora of the Western and Northern Cape Organised by Mediterranean Plants and Gardens



This tour will start and finish in Cape Town and will focus on the biodiversity of the unique fynbos vegetation and diversity of geophytes. Participants will see familiar garden plants growing in their natural habitat as well as many that are quite new. The Cape floristic region is home to the greatest non-tropical concentration of higher plant species in the world, with 9,000 species crammed into its small area. More than 6,200 (69 percent) of these are found nowhere else in the world.

The tour will be led by experienced guide, Frank Gaude. An optional extension from 27 - 31 August will provide an opportunity to see the sights of Cape Town and its surrounds. For more details, and to book, visit the <u>MPG website</u>.
